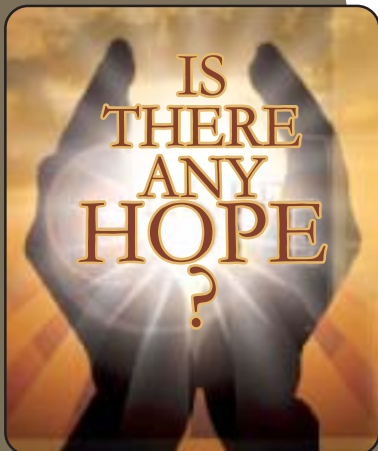

Jolliff Family Prepares to Plant Churches through IMB Program

The 'call'. Have you ever heard that word used by a Christian and thought, 'what do you mean?' Certainly the terminology leaves us inquiring the 'called' for explanation of their 'calling', this oftentimes being church workers and missionaries. Yet the New Testament writers use 'call' or 'calling' quite frequently, and not just in reference to church leaders. Rather, there is a call of God to all believers, to Himself and to the qualities and purpose of Himself. Jesus in Matthew 9:13b, "For I didn't come to call the righteous, but sinners." Paul in Romans 8:30, "And those He predestined, He also called; and those He called, He also justified . . ." Also in 1 Thessalonians 4:7, "For God has not called us to impurity, but to sanctification." And lastly Peter in 2 Peter 1:10 states, "Therefore, brothers, make every effort to confirm your calling and election, because if you do these things you will never stumble."

The reality is that every believer has received a call. A call to follow Jesus. A call to be like Him. A call to surrender to the Lord. A call to live like one who has been redeemed. A call from darkness to the Light. Moreover, God can and does call His



people to specific places and plans, calling them to trust in Him with every step. Sometimes He does this in an individual's life, and sometimes in collective lives, or in the church as a whole.

In the context of who we are and what we are becoming as Northside Baptist Church, and in context of Northside prayerfully supporting Tony and team in planting Hamilton Village this fall, Elizabeth and I believe God has too called us to church planting. The difference, at least for short-term, is to an international field. A field where maybe only one percent of the popula-

tion is Christian. A field where there may be one evangelical church for every thirty thousand people. A field where the comforts of central Indiana have never been dreamed of in peoples minds. A field that is in what continent - we do not know specifically, but we are trusting in the Lord with every step. We have begun application with the IMB through the International Service Corps program, and we hope to go to the field in 2010.

Ultimately, the Lord is sovereign and our hearts are His, but should we be able to return to Indy may it be to call out others to go! May it be to bridge Northside to the ends of the earth! We hope to serve in church planting efforts here and abroad, not forsaking one for the other. While we cannot not

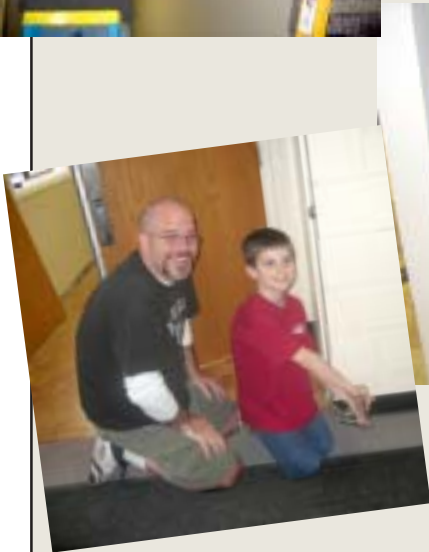
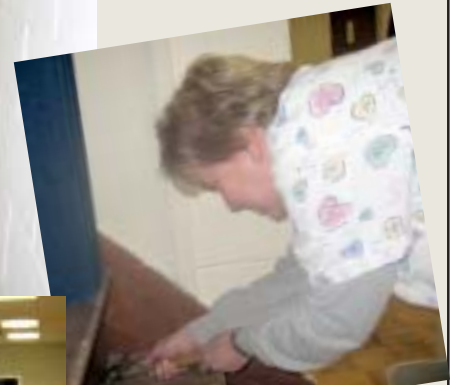
Upward Ministry Still Going Strong Gearing Up for Soccer Season

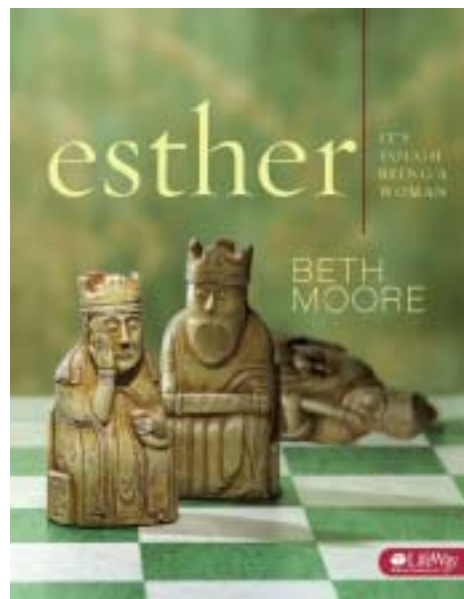

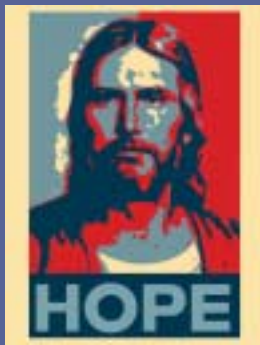
The **Precept study of Daniel Part 2** is currently meeting on Friday mornings at 9:30-11:30.

Covenant FOODS

Covenant Foods continues to grow and reach out to our community. Some exciting things have happened in the past month. Our food pantry ministry reaches beyond the walls of our church, not only in finding people in need, but also in finding those who are ready to serve. We are thankful that local residents, other churches and boy scout troops are joining in to provide food to the hungry. Volunteers from Boy Scout Troop 133, "The Action Troop," collected

688 items of food during its annual Scouting for Food event, held on March 21. Fourteen Scouts went door-to-door in their

neighborhoods to collect nonperishable canned and boxed goods to donate to two food pantries: Covenant Foods and Mid-North Food Pantry.

One Sunday morning in February, ten adults and fourteen students participated in the Northside Student Ministry's N-Service. They delivered homemade bread (baked by our own Senior Women's Class) and half gallons of milk (thank-you, Kroger) to approximately 24 homes of Covenant Foods clients. It was a blessing to have three generations working together to show Christ's love to others.

It's wonderful to see so many cooperating to help people. At the heart of our ministry here is not merely to provide food, though we all know food is essential to life. We remember the words of Jesus who said, "Man does not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God." Our food pantry holds out hope, the hope of Christ, to all who enter. Whether the counselor is able to speak with the client about their relationship with God or simply pray with him or her about ongoing needs, our ministry seeks to lift up Christ and draw all to Him.

Peoples Search Launch—April 25th

A Journey to Better Understanding Your Community



At Northside, God has provided us with an exciting opportunity to pilot a new approach to seeing our community from a spiritual perspective. It is easy to think we already know our community—this Jerusalem that God has called and empowered us to reach (Acts 1:8). Communities tend to change around us, even without our realizing it. There are undiscovered pockets of people throughout our local mission field who need to know Jesus and be a part of a church family. These pockets of people may be identified across the spectrum of ethnicity, or a geographic place or an affinity group. God has brought the nations and peoples to us in Indianapolis.

This process being developed by the North American Mission Board called People Search and People Teams addresses the need for locating and engaging people groups with practical discovery tools. This spring, it will be field tested here in Indianapolis with several first wave churches participating.

Van Sanders and Bob Burton from the North American Mission Board will be leading us in a pilot of **People Search Training on Saturday, April 25th from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM.**

You may be asking, "Who should participate in People Search on April 25th?" You should consider being there...

- If God has given you a burden for a particular people group.
- If you have an ethnic heritage and are concerned for your people.
- If you live in an apartment community.
- If you are a college student.
- If you have a hobby or special interest that you would like to use as a platform for ministry.
- If you have a particular city or neighborhood that God has placed on your heart.
- If you have co-workers from your profession that God has placed on your heart to see reached.
- If you are a part of a Connection Group.

The more people being trained ...the greater the impact. The focal point of the process is the Community Discovery Tool. It is here that people from our church will have the opportunity to go out into the community to discover unreached peoples and see the needs firsthand. Later, People Teams will then be formed to engage these newly discovered peoples in our local mission field. People Teams will be the natural byproduct of the People Search discovery process. Plan to be there on April 25th, a lunch will be provided.

October 2009 Trip to The Pacific Rim

Get ready for the Pacific Rim adventure. We are trusting God to help us put together a team to join missionaries Jacob and Alison on the mission field for a two-week trip. This young couple was commissioned here at Northside last year and has been serving full-time on the field since summer 2008.

The objective of the trip will be to engage in community development and humanitarian aid activities with the people that were severely impacted by the tsunami that hit that region in December 2004. Through those activities, we will be sharing the Truth one-on-one with anyone and everyone who asks. The climate is equatorial, so we will be physically challenged, but the eternal rewards will be so much greater. The dates of the trip are October 23



thru November 6. The area we will be going to is a 12-hour time difference from Indiana, and travel time is more than 30 hours. The preliminary budget is \$700 plus airfare.



Now is the time to begin praying about (1) your level of involvement, and (2) about the people that we will be meeting—that their hearts will be prepared and open to discussing the Truth. It is exciting to see the opportunity that we have before us,

and as God leads over the next seven months, the trip will materialize.

You won't want to miss this opportunity to serve alongside and encourage missionaries who have once sat where you sit.

In March, I was privileged to travel to Ukraine with a group of five other women, including Bev Olonoh. The other ladies had traveled to Ukraine prior, but this was my first overseas mission experience. It was a blessing!

We, along with the missionaries and local believers in Ukraine, hosted three Women's Day Conferences. These conferences focused on specific age groups and the Lord blessed us with around 250 people in attendance for the three days. Some of the young women traveled for

hours via train to attend and hear the word of God spoken. It was refreshing to see their heart for the Lord and their desire to hear and not be just be entertained.

We were also able to worship in various church plants and attend discipleship classes with new local believers. We prayer walked areas of Kharkov with the prayer that God would raise up local believ-

ers to partner with missionaries for new church plants. We also attended and participated in English classes. These classes are opportunities to talk about

ourselves and the Reason we traveled to Ukraine. These classes were some of my favorite times while in Ukraine.

This trip has opened my eyes to the work in Ukraine and put faces to the missionary names printed in the bulletin each week. On the surface, we in America, I myself, and the Ukrainian people are oh, so different—literally worlds apart. But once you talk with the people and get to know the stories behind the hard exterior you soon realize that we are struggling with the same things and that we all need the Savior so badly each day to survive. I realized that whether I worship in Indiana or in Kharkov we worship the same God and we who believe are one big beautiful family of God regardless of where we are in this world. One thing is for sure, I would go back to Ukraine in a heartbeat and the people of Ukraine will forever be in my heart.

I am also confident that God has a place for Hamilton Village to meet and grow. Not only does He have a place for us to meet, but He has a place for us to eventually call home. God is going to provide a ministry hub that meets the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of families in Fishers. Temporarily the hub will likely be a rented facility of some kind. This facility will be a place that has room for growth for our worship services as well as adequate space for our children. We are very aware that a positive environment for children is key for a second visit and assimilation.

The other area that I'm confident that God will provide is prospects. Who are they? I know some, you know some, we all know some. The point is, there are a lot of people out there dealing with a lot of junk in their lives. These prospects vary in experiences with church. Some have never been to church. They have tried to create their own filter in which to live their lives. They need Jesus and He is drawing them to Him. Some of the prospects left the church for some reason or another. They left the church because they felt the church left them. They have attempted to find community outside of church fellowship and are yearning for unity, purpose, and direction. Some of our prospects are new to our community and are looking for a church home to replace the church home they left behind. They have a great commission heart and want to use their giftedness to expand the Kingdom. Our prayer is that God will allow our paths to cross with the various kinds of prospects.
