That day marked the beginning of an initiative of the North American Mission Board and the Ethics and Religious Liberties Commission of the Southern Baptist Church—the 40/40 Prayer Vigil. Our nation is facing serious threats: increasingly high fuel prices, unstable mortgage and housing industries, financial crisis and international concerns of terrorism and weapons in the hands of rogue nations. We cannot rely on our own devices as the solution. We can get out and vote, and we should. But beyond that, we need to declare our dependence on God. The 40/40 Prayer Vigil consists of 40 days of prayer from September 24 to November 2, 2008, culminating in 40 hours of around the clock intercession during the last 3 days of the Vigil. Northside will host an onsite vigil during that time (October 31 through November 2). The Vigil focuses first on personal spiritual revival. It then covers an expanding circle of prayer concerns, from the church to the nation. What better way to prepare for the coming elections than to ask the Lord of Heaven and Earth to have His way in our hearts and in our country!

October is Missions Month

As October brings in the cooler temperatures of Fall, it also ushers in our **Annual Missions Emphasis Month**. Each week during the month you will hear about how your offerings, given throughout the year to our BJ Higgins Missions Fund, are used to impact our areas of mission-related opportunities. The Bible teaches us: *"...you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere—in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."* (Acts 1:8)

These were the last words of Jesus to his disciples before He ascended into heaven from the Mount of Olives. We take these words to heart at Northside and have shaped our mission work around the four areas relative to us.

Jerusalem: Ministry in Our Community

- Our **Community Hog Roast and Fall Picnic**, the first Sunday of October, is an intentional effort to meet our neighbors. Nearly 1000 invitations were distributed to neighborhoods around the church.
- **Northside Covenant Foods** opened on September 9, 2008. This food pantry is here to reach out to the hungry people in our community.

■ Northside has a long-standing relationship with the **Metro Baptist Center** in downtown Indianapolis. Every month, church members contribute clothing and toiletries to the needy people of our community. Every year at Christmas, Northsiders contribute food for food baskets and toys for shoebox gifts for underprivileged children. The Baptist Center also provides counseling and members of Northside volunteer to assist in that.

■ **All Things in Common** is a ministry of a group of adults in our church who seek to provide furniture and other needs to people in the community.

■ **Bless Your Heart** ministry regularly assists elderly and disabled individuals by providing free manual labor.

■ **Upward Sports** is another local ministry that provides recreation to young people. It also nurtures in the participants the desire to know Jesus as Savior and Lord.

Judea: Ministry in Our State

■ **Disaster Relief:** On Saturday, October 18, we will take a group of volunteers to Columbus, Indiana for the day to help families who are still rebuilding from the devastating summer floods. Sign up yourself or your whole family to help that day as we minister to those around our state.

■ Northside has coined a new term for folks who take their musical talents and go on mission for the Lord: **Musicianaries**. We have several members who regularly carry the gospel around our state in the form of song. Once again this year, our choir and musicians are providing leadership for our annual state convention meetings October 3rd and 4th.

■ **Highland Lakes Baptist Camp** in Monrovia, Indiana is a wonderful retreat place for people of all ages. Northsiders regularly support the camp financially and by working on construction projects. Look for some Saturday dates in November to be set as we try and help finish the outside of the new conference and

retreat center. It is important that the center be winterized before the onset of bad weather. Plenty of work remains to be done through the winter months.

Samaria: Reaching North America

■ Our **Mystery Mission Trip** will land us "somewhere" in our "Samaria" to minister to families recovering from disasters. Note, that I am not giving away the destination as that statement is true of the south from Florida to Texas, as well as, the midwest all the way to Chicago and on to the east coastal states. We will drive overnight on the LightRider Sleeper Bus and arrive at our destination on Thursday morning October 23. We will return on Sunday morning, October 26, in time for the morning worship service. This group is limited to a maximum of 32. Room is still available.

■ Currently, Northside has a partnership with a church in **Vancouver, British Columbia (Canada)** where the Olympics will be held in 2010. Groups have traveled to assist the church in several areas including women's ministry and Upward Basketball.

■ We are also working with Art and Jill Hallett and **Hallett Ministries** to carry the gospel to prisons throughout North America. Three to four weekend trips will be planned each year. Art also is head of the **Evangelism Explosion Ministry to Prisons** for North America.

■ Groups of Northsiders are always on call for **disaster relief**. When hurricane Katrina hit the Mississippi and Louisiana areas, our members made themselves available to help rebuild.

The Ends of the Earth: Reaching the World with the Gospel

■ Currently, Northside has partnerships with Southern Baptist missionaries in the countries of **Ukraine** and **Mexico**. Groups and individuals from our church have gone and continue to go on short-term trips to encourage and assist the missionaries. The emphasis of each trip can vary. Some go to help with medical needs or teaching children. Others may go to prayer walk and interact with the people. The common theme of every trip is to look for opportunities to share the gospel of Jesus with those

who don't know Him.

■ In addition to these partnerships, Northside's members go as groups and individuals to other areas of the world as God calls them. We are in contact with former members of Northside who are now serving as full time missionaries in countries such as Scotland, Nigeria, Kenya, Costa Rica and the Pacific Rim. We hope to reach each of these missionaries with teams over the next two to three years. You will be given an opportunity to sign up this October for trips that interest you. Each summer several of our students travel with Awe Star, a missionary organization now led by former Northside members Brent Higgins.

■ Women on Mission is a group of dedicated ladies within our church who regularly meet to pray for overseas missions and who look for ways they can help from here at home.

All this is only the tip of the iceberg when it come to mission support at Northside Baptist Church. A part of every dollar given to our church goes to support missionaries and their efforts throughout North America and literally around the world through our North American Mission Board and our International Mission Board supported by Southern Baptist Church worldwide. These are by far the largest missionary organizations in the world with more than 5,000 missionaries in the field.

But let me conclude by saying that Northside has long had a heart for not only supporting missions financially, but sending missionaries as well. From weekend trips, week long trips, multi-week trips to one or two year journeyman commitments, to even life long commitments. We want to provide you and your family an opportunity to give yourself away for the sake of the gospel of Jesus Christ. We do not expect everyone to do everything. However, **we greatly encourage everyone, choose something you and your family can participate in this next year that is mission-minded.**

The "Unreached" People Group Within Our Church

As a student at The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary I am studying Missiology (the study of missions). One phrase that is repeated over and over again in my classes, and I am sure you have heard is "Unreached People Groups". We talk about remote tribes in Papua New Guinea or in the Democratic Republic of Congo having not heard the gospel, but I want you to think about the people group within our church that, so far, has been unreached by our fellowship. I do not refer to them in the sense that they have not heard the Gospel but rather that as a church we have failed to connect with them and spur them on in their love and good deeds. The group I am talking about is the college and career group, including all young adults ages 18-25.

This age group is important for a number of reasons: They are at an age in life when they will make important decisions impacting their future. They for the first time in their lives are free to make any decision they want and face the consequence. They are most of the time struggling to get by financially (all while they accumulate enormous amounts of debts from school), and they are the future and will one day be in control of everything other generations have built. Young people will one day take over the responsibility of reaching the lost and spreading the name of Jesus Christ and it is our job to equip them for this task. Unfortunately, this group has often times gone unnoticed and even excluded from the fellowship shared with the rest of the body. We have poured time and money in developing young people through their high school years, but we have dropped the ball as soon as they become of voting age. I would like to see this attitude change and would like to provide ways for you to connect with some of our young people.

The first opportunity I want to present to you is a new program we are starting this school year it is called **Adopt-a-Student**, in which you can adopt a student that you may spend time with however you decide. This adoption can literally be whatever you feel comfortable with, whether that be having them in your home for a nice home-cooked meal or you meeting with them on a weekly basis. For some you may adopt a student who is attending a school far away that you could encourage through a gift box or a simple letter. The goal is to form relationships that will strengthen our community of believers, and to encourage our students through this time in their lives. If you are interested in adopting one of our students please contact me at thall@worshipfortoday.com or at the church office. From there we will give you the name and contact information of one Northside college student (either here in the Indy area or away at school). This will be a one-year commitment, but you may always re-adopt your student next year. The best part is that these students have already expressed their interest in being adopted!

Another way we are reaching our young people and keeping them plugged in will be through a **College Road Trip**. We are inviting all juniors and seniors in high school on a three day two night trip to the most excellent universities our state has to offer. We will be visiting schools that the students are interested in for college. We will meet with a representative from the school as well as the local BCM's and other collegiate ministries on campus. This

trip is designed to help students decide where they will go to college and also for them to meet some of the key people that will help them to grow in Christ while at school. We will be leaving on this trip November 23rd and will return on the 25th in the evening. The schools we will visit have yet to be determined based on the interest from the students. If you are interested in helping with this trip in any way or if you would like to be apart of the trip contact me at the above email address.

These are just a couple of ways that we as a community may grow and reach the "unreached". I know that these are very simple things but I believe that the results will be enormous and eternal. If we, as Christians, are to really reach the ends of the earth in the next 30-40 years with the Gospel message, then that task will lay in the hands of today's young people. Therefore we must begin bridging the gaps between age groups and generations so that they may complete the tasks we begin.





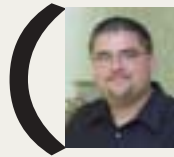

Can Competition and Christianity Co-Exist?

Over the past several years, a familiar knocking at the door of my heart has occurred and reoccurred. It is all too familiar of a feeling, the same daunting question, the same nudging of my spirit, a beckoning call of my attention and action, "how does my competitive nature coexist with my relationship with Jesus Christ?" Of course when I took the time to stop and ponder this question, many more surfaced:

- "What does it mean, or look like, to be a Christian athlete?"
- "How can an athlete shed light through his actions on the playing field?"
- "Can an athlete play with competitive passion and the objective to win, yet display humility in both wins and defeats?"
- "How can one follow Matthew 22:36-40 in an athletic arena?"
- "Are loving and following Jesus Christ manly things to do?"
- "How can one follow Philippians 2:12-18 through actions in locker room?"
- "How can kids be coached in a manner that will discipline them yet shower them with the love of Jesus so they feel important, capable, and inspired to give their all?"

Admittedly, the list could be much longer, but I am sparing those reading thus far! As one can see, these are some serious questions that we all must face and live up to if we desire to participate in sports, while at the same time desiring to live our lives for Jesus. As a person who was in the locker room environment from when I was a little kid through the time I became a man during college, I know how crude and challenging it can be for a Christian to handle being in a non-Church friendly environment. This is just one facet of the complex struggle I was faced with in the sports arena; another would be that of the very type of competitor I was defined as per my abilities, actions, and words. There were many instances throughout and after my career of playing football and basketball, when I would lose my temper or become hyper aggressive, and say or do something I would no doubt regret. It became such a problem, that people who knew me off the field or court questioned whether I was the same person who "suited up" to play. Being a person who values integrity of character, I did not enjoy knowing that people had questions about "who I really was". It was during this time of realization that I discovered the pressing question on my heart, "how does, or can, my competitive nature coexist with my relationship with Jesus Christ?"
